- There was concern that some of the content was more youth-oriented and that we need to remember that the Committee should focus on adult services.
- Moving forward, the Committee should consider:
 - An ice-breaker activity.
 - Sending save-the-date/invitation earlier so that staff can secure necessary approvals.
 - Sorting the names listed at the registration table in a way that they are easier to find as attendees arrive.
 - o Having a laptop for Committee members who are working the registration table.
 - Having presenters meet a week or a few days prior to share their presentations with each other so that they can synergize their talks.
